- 8. To ensure our students' well-being, they will be given additional five-minute **snack breaks** within curriculum time. All students will have a snack break at 9.30 am, 11.00am and 1.00 pm. Students are encouraged to bring snacks that are simple, nutritious, and easily consumed within the designated break time, e.g. sandwiches and muesli bars. They will <u>not</u> be allowed to purchase food in the canteen or the café during the time given.
- GCE O-Level MTL/MTLB Listening Comprehension Examination. The Listening Comprehension Examination will be held on 8 July 2025 from 1.30pm. In preparation for the examination and to provide a conducive environment for our graduating students taking the examination, students who are not involved in the examination will be dismissed at 12.30pm.
- 10. <u>Co-Curricular Activities (CCAs)</u>. Sec 1 to 3 students will stand down from CCA after 2 September (Tue), to allow sufficient time to prepare for their End-of-Year Examinations. See <u>Annex A</u> for the updated CCA schedule for Semester 2. Students absent from CCA should submit a medical certificate (MC) or parent's letter to their CCA teacher to ensure prompt and accurate updating of CCA attendance.
- 11. To provide additional support for learning, <u>Mastery Learning Programme (MLP)</u> lessons may be conducted for students after school on the following days. Teachers will inform students of the details of each MLP lesson at least one day in advance. We seek your cooperation to ensure that your child/ward attends MLP lessons so that he/she

Orion StaRs After School Engagement (Sec 1 & 2 only)

- 12. Orion StaRs After School Engagement aims at providing students with meaningful engagement after school through interest-based activities (e.g. craft activities, sports etc.). It also aims to enhance students' personal and social and emotional (SEL) competencies and strengthen peer relationships and teacher-student relationships.
- 13. The activities will be managed by at least one member of staff and an external instructor engaged by the school. Details are as follows:

Term 3 School Events

- 14. Term 3 consists of a variety of exciting school programmes and celebrations for National Day and Teachers' Day.
- 15. Please refer to Annex B for the key school events in Term 3, as well as other important dates for the rest of the year. More details on the events will be provided at a later date.

Term 3 Weighted Assessments (WAs)

- 16. Weighted Assessments (WA) refer to assessments where the scores form part of the computation of a student's overall results in a subject for the year. Each subject has at most one Weighted Assessment per school term. This allows teachers to better pace out teaching and learning and enhance students' learning experiences. In turn, this helps students to build their confidence and develop an intrinsic motivation to learn. Weighted Assessments can take different forms for different subjects: Class Tests, Practical Tests, Projects, Performance Tasks, Coursework, or Assignments. Please refer to Annex C for the assessment schedule in Term 3.
- 17. Students will not be given any make-up time if they report late for class tests. If students report after the end of a class test, they will be deemed absent for the test.
- 18. Absence from Weighted Assessment (WA) must be covered with a Medical Certificate with the diagnosis stated, from a qualified medical practitioner for the school's consideration. Parents' letters are not allowed.
- 19. In the event of absence from class tests due to valid reasons, e.g. representing school or country in official sanctioned competitions and conferences, a "Valid Reason (VR)" will be given for the class test. This is in recognition of students' holistic development, given that student development and academic domains are both important. Students can attempt the class test at a later date for practice purposes, and feedback will be given to support their learning.
- 20. Beyond WAs, teachers also formatively assess learning outcomes, strengths, and areas for growth of each student by employing questioning techniques during lessons and assigning class work and homework. Teachers will indicate the assigned homework on the Homework Board in the classroom, and students should record in their copy of the

Student Handbook.

21. Students are strongly encouraged to seek consultations with teachers in other subject areas, whenever they are in doubt. This will help address learning gaps in a timely manner.

Preliminary Examinations and End-of-Year Examinations

- 22. The Preliminary Examinations will be conducted from **29 July to 3 September** for **Sec 4 and 5** students. The Endof-Year Examinations will be conducted from **25 September to 9 October** for Sec 1 to 3 students. The Examination timetable will be issued to students at a later date. StaRs Programme 3

23. A myriad of activities will be planned for our students' holistic development in StaRs Programme 3. We seek to enable our students to make connections between classroom learning and out-of-classroom learning, develop their character, social and emotional competencies and skills, and deepen their sense of belonging to the school. StaRs Programme 3 will take place in the **last week of Term 4**. More details will be provided later.

Home-Based Learning (HBL) and Student-Initiated Learning (SIL)

- 24. As announced by MOE, Blended Learning is a key feature of the schooling experience to further develop students' ability to be self-directed, passionate, and life-long learners. Through Blended Learning, regularly scheduled HBL Days once a fortnight complement teaching and learning in schools. Students' learning during HBL Days is supported by the NDLP and their procured PLDs (see above).
- 25. At Serangoon Secondary, HBL Days will take place fortnightly for **Sec 1 to 3 students** only. Below is the schedule for HBL Days for Semester 2:

- 26. A conducive learning environment and access to ICT devices at home are necessary for learning to take place effectively during HBL Days. The school will continue to support students without access to ICT devices. Selected students, based on needs, will also be identified to return to school for in-school HBL during HBL Days.
- 27. <u>Student-Initiated Learning (SIL)</u>. The school has enrolled the Sec 1 students in online modules aimed at enhancing their digital literacy, particularly in word processing and presentation skills. These modules are designed to equip students with a mastery of practical digital skills essential for success in the future digital workplace. Students are required to complete the modules by term 4 and submit a reflection that demonstrates their application of the skills acquired in creating their reflection.
- 28. As shared in the 2025 Term 1 Letter, Sec 2 and Sec 3 students will be embarking on their 'Student-Initiated Learning' (SIL) during the designated Home-Based Learning (HBL) days. It is scheduled to be carried out after the HBL curriculum lessons. Parents/Guardians are strongly encouraged to play an active role in checking in with your child/ward on the selected SIL activity, and to encourage and motivate your child/ward to give his/her best in the pursuit of the activity

School Expectations

- 29. Regular attendance is integral to student learning and engagement in school. Attendance in school is important to ensure all students gain knowledge and skills consistently throughout the term. Being present in school regularly will also increase the opportunities for positive relationship-building amongst students and between teachers and students.
- 30. A medical certificate, from a medical practitioner registered under the Medical Registration Act on the Singapore Medical Council website, is required if your child/ward is unwell and unable to attend school. A parent's letter may be provided for other types of valid absences, e.g. bereavement. **Permission must be sought from the Principal via Form Teachers for all other absences, including overseas travel, during the school term.**
- 31. There is a new Student Absence feature on Parents Gateway (PG) where parents/guardians will be able to submit reasons for your child's/ward's absence, and attach medical certificates and documents all on the PG app. Please refer to the PG announcement on 23 Jun for the user guide and FAQ document.
- 32. As part of the whole-of-nation effort to harness digital technologies to transform Singapore, parents/guardians may now receive a digital MC (DigiMC) from doctors instead. Kindly submit the DigiMC to the school via FormSG (https://for.edu.sg/sss-emc). The details to submit a DigiMC may also be found on our school's website at (https://www.serangoonsec.moe.edu.sg/parents-and-students/General-Matters/submission-of-electronic-medical-cert/).
- 33. Students coming in 7.40am will be regarded as late for school and will face consequences (e.g. serving detention). We encourage students to arrive in school at least five minutes before the respective reporting time. This will help them frame their mind and prepare themselves to learn for the rest of the day. Latecomers' mobile phones will be kept in the general office until curriculum ends so that students can go to class promptly after admin procedures.
- 34. As a school, we strive to inculcate appropriate and responsible device usage in our students. Unless allowed by teachers for learning purposes during lessons, handphone usage is restricted to before 7.40 am and after dismissal. Handphones are not allowed during recess, so that students can focus on taking their meals or interacting with their peers. Parents/Guardians can contact the General Office at 6385 1589 if you need to contact your child/ward urgently. Infringement of rules on the use of electronic devices/handphones may result in the confiscation of the device. Students who need to contact their parents can also use the telephone placed outside the General Office.
- 35. The upkeep of our school facilities is crucial to ensure that our ongoing refurbishment efforts provide a conducive learning environment for our students. To achieve this, we have emphasized to all members of the school community that everyone plays a vital role in caring for our upgraded facilities. We take incidents of wilful damage to school property seriously and will take necessary actions to recover the costs of repairs or replacement. For example, the cost of replacing a damaged door frame is \$700, while a damaged PLD locker door costs \$80. We kindly request the support of all parents/guardians in instilling a sense of responsibility and care among our students towards maintaining public properties.
- 36. Students are expected to wear the full school uniform on Mondays, and they have the choice of wearing full school uniform or half school uniform (PE shirt with pants/skirt) from Tuesdays to Fridays. Members of Uniformed Groups (UGs) can also wear their UG pants/skirts with their boots/shoes on Tuesdays and/or Thursdays.
- 37. Parents/Guardians are encouraged to remind your child/ward to queue for buses in an orderly manner, be respectful and considerate towards other passengers while on public transport and minimise talking amongst themselves.
- 38. Further information on school expectations and rules, such as on student bearing and appearance, can be found in Pages 11 to 21 of our Student Handbook, which is available at https://www.serangoonsec.moe.edu.sg/parents-and-students/student-handbook/

Safety and Security

- 39. To ensure a safe and smooth commute to school, all student cyclists are required to register with our Operations Manager. When cycling to school, students must adhere to road safety guidelines and are strongly encouraged to wear cycling helmets, even if the students are using park connectors and pedestrian pavements for their entire commute. As part of our commitment to student safety, we have a strict policy of not allowing bicycles without functional brakes and personal mobility devices (PMDs) within the school compound.
- 40. Travel Declarations: To ensure schools continue to be a healthy and safe environment for all, we require you to make a travel declaration via Parents Gateway (PG) by 5 September 2025 (Friday) for your child/ward only if he/she intends to travel during the September holidays. When planning your travel, please refer to ica.gov.sg/enter-transit-depart for more information and updates on travel. If there is a change of travel plan(s) after declaration, please submit a new travel declaration for the updated travel destination via PG or inform the school at

Tel: 63851589 for change/cancellation of travel plan(s).

- 41. To maintain a safe and secure school environment, we require all visitors to follow these steps:
 - a) Register at the Guard Room and obtain a visitor's pass from the security personnel.
 - b) Proceed to the General Office. Visitors are not permitted to proceed to other parts of the school, including the classrooms.
 - c) Please remain at the school foyer or General Office unless accompanied by a school staff.

42. As mentioned in our Term 1 letter, we wish to inform you that photographs and videos taken at all school events, as well as students' work, may be published on the school's official media platforms (e.g. school website) and used for briefings, workshops, displays, and other educational purposes.
