
SCHOOL HISTORY

Serangoon Secondary School began in 1928 as Serangoon English School. In 1949, the school became a full school offering education from Primary One to Cambridge School Certificate. In 1957, it was converted to a secondary school serving residents of Upper Serangoon district. In 1967, the school relocated to Lowland Road and was renamed Serangoon Secondary School. In 2000, it moved to its present premises at 11, Upper Serangoon View.

Since its inception, Serangoon Secondary School has not only made a number of remarkable achievements in its provision of education to those living in its neighbourhood but has also produced a cabinet minister, educationalists, doctors, dental surgeons, businessmen and professionals in other fields.




